Regional HHP Model

- Outside Tulsa Residents Access HHPF
 - Voucher System administered by The M.e.t.
 - M.e.t. Educates Residents & Lowers
 Unnecessary Use/Wasted Trips to HHPF
- The M.e.t/Cities Push Overlap Items to Depot
 - Oil, batteries, antifreeze, fryer oil
 - Convenient 24/7 drop off services at M.e.t. Depot
- The M.e.t. Holds Local Specialty Collections
 - Collect items not handled by HHPF smoke/fire
 - Collect items w/no need to take to HHPF bulbs, medications, ammunition, TBD
